QUILTED BABY KEEPSAKES SUPPLIES

- Lightweight Fusible Stabilizer
- Rotary Cutter
- Quilting Ruler
- Self-healing Cutting Mat
- Quilting Cotton
- Standard Sewing Machine Supplies


INSTRUCTIONS

These instructions are to make the quilt top only, the sandwiching, basting, quilting and binding are done like all other quilts.

Step 1: Rough cut down baby clothes - removing arms and seams leaving only flat fabric. (this is typically found on the body of the clothes.)




Step 2: Cut lightweight fusible stabilizer 7x7" or to desired size.




Step 3: Iron the 7x7 fusible squares to backs of rough cut baby clothes.



Step 4: Once ironed on, cut clothes down to 7x7- equal size of stabilizer squares.



Step 5: Cut strips of quilting cotton 3x7" or width of fabric. Sew right sides together to squares and rows for sashing and borders.



Step 6: Sew 7 inch strips to squares right sides together.



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Step 7: Sew blocks and strips together to make rows. Sew long strips between rows to divide them



Step 8: Sew all the rows together until your quilt top is your desired size.



Step 9: Optional - Don't be afraid to preserve matching outfit pieces and applique them onto the block for added interest and texture.

Or try layering pieces with open necks and sleeves to solid onesies for a more complete looking block









Step 10: Finish by sandwiching with batting and backing, quilting and binding.



QUILTED JERSEY KEEPSAKES SUPPLIES

- Old Sports Jerseys
- Tear Away Stabilizer
- Rotary Cutter
- Quilting Ruler
- Self Healing Cutting Mat
- Fabric Scissors
- Basic Sewing Machine Supplies

INSTRUCTIONS



Step 1: Cut the arms off of the jersey with fabric scissors and separate the shirt at the neck/shoulders, preserving the logo on the front and the number on the back.




Step 2: Square up fabric. 16 x 16 inches or desired size. TIP! Try preserving laces for more authenticity & texture.





Step 3: Cut strips of fabric 3 x 16 inches or desired length. These will be used to separate the squares.

Step 4: Cut 2 x 16 inch strips of tear away stabilizer. One for each strip of quilting cotton. This will help stabilize the jersey & cottons trips when sewing together. Stabilizers should be placed on the bottom of the sandwich closest to feed dogs when sewing.





Step 5: Sew strips to jerseys that will make your CENTRE BLOCK right sides together and make rows with 3 jerseys per row. Then, sew the right side jersey and left side jersey to the centre strips.



Step 6: Cut strips 3 inches by length of rows and sew to rows, to separate rows. Use long strips of tearaway stabilizer if necessary.





Step 7: Sew all rows together and then tear away the stabilizer.



To Finish: The quilt will still need to be sandwiched with batting and backing, quilted and bound.
